HISTORY OF WOODBADGE

Wood Badge is BSA's most advanced leadership training course. It began in 1919 by Lord Baden-Powell, Scouting's Founder and Wood Badge's first Course Director. The Wood Badge Course came to America in 1948. It has continually been updated to reflect the current BSA policies and programs, including a new addition this 2017 year, "Servant Leadership". Wood Badge incorporates the latest materials and utilizes the best training techniques available.

THE WOOD BADGE PROCESS

Wood Badge consists of two phases. The first is the practical phase. This consists of two full weekends at our camps. The second, or application phase, occurs after the weekends and consists of "working your ticket". As part of the practical course you create a plan to put the leadership skills in action, called a "Ticket." You will have a period of 18 months to "Work Your Ticket."

COURSE FEE:

The course fee is \$275.00. With an early bird fee of \$250.00 if received before May 1st. A deposit of \$50.00 is due with completed application to hold your spot. The course is limited to 48 participants. The deadline to be for signed up and paid in full is July 18, 2017. There are need-based scholarships available, check on the Baden-Powell Council web site and with the course director. Also check with your Scouting unit for additional assistance. Also check with your place of employment, many businesses acknowledge this training and help with course costs.
