LOCAL BOY SCOUTS TREK THROUGH NEW MEXICO WILDERNESS



A crew of teenage Scouts and their leaders went on a life changing summer trek through the Sangre de Cristo Mountains at Philmont Scout Ranch in Cimarron, New Mexico. Philmont covers 214 square miles of vast wilderness with trails that climb from 6,500 feet to as high as 12,441 feet. During their trek Boy Scout Troop/Venture Crew # 717-I associated with Troop 202 sponsored by the First Baptist Church of Endicott and our Delaware Counter parts Troop 186 hiked over 73 miles over 10 days. The crew members departed Endicott on July 13. They visited the Peterson Air Force Base and Museum, Garden of the Gods, Pikes Peak & its Cogs Railway, US Air Force Academy, and Royal Gorge with White Water Rafting. Troop 186 member was Dakota Madanat. Troop 202 Crew Members included Andrew Burlingame, Patrick Dimock, Colin MacHaffie, David Wilson, Alex Plesnar, Aaron Williams, Bruce Williams, Ed Plesnar, and Greg Shepherd.

The group of Scouts and their advisors carried everything they needed to survive during the trek on their backs while hiking from camp to camp. They participated in backcountry programs along the way including rock climbing, mountain biking, fly-fishing and gold prospecting. The trek included a conservation project where the Scouts learned and participated in the upkeep of Philmont's ecosystem. Along the trek, Scouts endured tough challenges including backpacking in bear and mountain lion territory, steep climbs, and often-inclement weather.

"They may meet only one other group of Scouts on the trail in an entire day of hiking," according to Backpacker Magazine. "Even in the most crowded destinations, each Scout group camps in isolation, out of sight and sound of all other groups." The crew made what amounts to a Scouting pilgrimage with their trip to Philmont. Philmont Scout Ranch is the Boy Scouts of America's premier high adventure camp and the largest youth camp in the world serving nearly one million participants since 1938.

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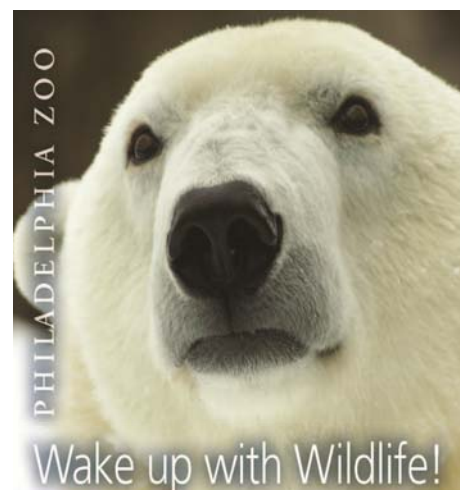

6. SUPPORT THEM—Everyone wants to feel like they have a resource to be successful.
7. RECOGNIZE THEM—"Thank you" are two of the most powerful words in our language.

The temptation to do the job ourselves or to just work with those that seek to help will be very strong this fall, but do your best to reach out to those parents and other resources around your unit or district and ENGAGE them in supporting your unit or district activities. Scouting will be a stronger organization and the youth we serve will benefit from the effort.

CUB SCOUT FAMILY ADVENTURE WEEKENDS

Camp Barton: Oct. 6-7, 2012
Camp Tuscarora: Oct 13-14, 2012

Cub Scout Family Adventure Weekends are theme based camping experiences for all Cub Scouts and Webelos offered in the Fall at our Camps—Barton and Tuscarora. Cub Scouts of all ranks are encouraged to attend these Weekends with their parents/guardians and other family members. Here's a chance to come and see what our Camps have to offer, to experience the great outdoors and to have fun!! *This year, enjoy Halloween at "Boo at Barton" and go BUGGY over "Cubs & Bugs" at Tuscarora!*

Come up for the day or make an overnight (optional) of it. About 70% stay overnight in either Cabins (Barton) or Winter Lean-to Units (Tuscarora) that house eight persons each. **Both cabins/lean-to's have bunk beds and mattresses. Cabin or lean-to space is at a first come, first serve so register early. Families may bring their own tents/camping gear if they like.** Note: An adult partner is required to attend this program. The cost is \$20 per youth and \$15 per adult and includes three meals (lunch and dinner Saturday and breakfast on Sunday) as well as a Saturday night snack. Reservations and payment are due by Pack to the Council Office no later than 7 days before the start of the weekend you are attending or a late fee of \$10.00/ person will be assessed. A **Medical Form is required for ALL Participants including Adults.**
